We hope you had an enjoyable and restful summer and are looking forward to a profitable school year.




#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

#### SCHOOL'S OPEN - DRIVE CAREFULLY

We're back again at our "familiar stand" with a few ALL IMPORTANT rules for all children and their parents.

- 1. Direct your children to "cross" at the designated crossings, preferably where the Policewoman is there to direct them.
- 2. Travel at the slow 15 M.P.H. speed within the "School Zone".
- 3. Pick up and discharge children at the official assigned areas.
- 4. Do not enter the School Yard for pickups or drop-offs. This creates an additional hazard to our "SCHOOL WALKERS". This yard is for "Emergency Business and Official School Personnel only".

#### HEALTH APPRAISAL

The New York State Education Law requires that every child have an annual health examination by a qualified physician. Since the family physician is most familiar with the health problems of your child and best able to institute treatment where needed, we urgeyou to take your child to your family doctor. At the same time all immunizations could be brought up to date. All responsible health authorities are emphasizing the great importance, particularly of tetanus (lockjaw) and measles immunization.

If your child has not been examined by your family physician, and the medical form returned to the health room by November 1st, he will be scheduled for a health appraisal by the school physician.
